# January Updates 2025

**Pastor** As another year comes to a close and a new one begins, I am always amazed, when looking back, to see all that we have accomplished together. I would be lying if I said that I had no doubts that two congregations, so close to one another in geographic proximity and with such a long history with one another, would be able to serve together as well as we have for the past few years. There are many congregations in Northwest Ohio, the Heartland Conference, and even nationally who are struggling to make ends meet, to live up to their historic standards, and, in some cases, even to find or have a full-time ministry. And yet, here in the community of Bluffton, we have found a way together.

In large part I believe that our survivability is due to the Spirit of God, for sure, but also because of our willingness to adapt to our circumstances, live within our means (even when the Pastor has crazy ideas of how to spend more money/resources), and work together for the betterment of our community. As a minister, we are often compared to shepherds, with Christ being The Shepherd of The Flock of Christ's Church. A shepherd's task is not an easy one as oftentimes sheep can be rather stubborn, silly, and seemingly scatterbrained. We hear that Jesus leaves the 99 in order to seek out the 1, but that is because the 1 has wandered off and is probably stuck in the same place it always gets stuck. Jesus knows where to look for that 1.

This is a beautiful analogy, however it is not entirely accurate when describing the task of the modern day minister. Sheep, when you ask a real shepherd or farmer, are fairly dumb animals. Members of congregations are not. We are all thinking, feeling, and opinionated individuals who have decided to put our personal wills aside in order to discern together what God's Will is for us in our lives. And, more importantly, what God's Will is for our congregations. We find ourselves constantly asking, "How can we better serve?", "What more can we do?", "How might we be able to give back?" and these are wonderful discerning questions.

Where we can get hung up is when questions like, "How do we get more people here?" and "How can we make more money?" become our focus. Jesus did not have focus groups where he tested out slogans and products in order to get the best reaction and highest sales numbers. He wasn't worried about shareholders or bottom lines. He conducted ministry and the people followed. He fed the people, and they followed. Jesus healed the people, and they followed. He served the people, and they followed. This is how the church began to grow, as a byproduct of his ministry. Outreach was done by word of mouth. He spoke, and the people listened. He sent out his disciples so that they might speak, and the people listened. The community of Bluffton is listening. And so the question we should be asking is this, "What are *we* saying?". "What is *God* saying, through us?"

Now I've mentioned this many times before and so it should come as no surprise to you, that in a community of around 4,000 people (on a good day), we now have 13+ congregations hailing from all parts of our Protestant faith. The Church Universal in our community has a lot of 'white noise' out there. I mean that not to say our faith is 'white noise', but there are a lot of God's children speaking and we are not necessarily cornering the market on God's Holy Word. This is a *good* thing! God's hands are working in this community. God's Spirit is working in this community. I am reminded of this fact every time I gather with the Bluffton Area Ministerial Association with some really great pastor friends here in the community.

But what I am also reminded of every year, is that, while our community has a great faith, there are still many in our community who have not claimed their faith by claiming a church family as their own. With our ability to be flexible, to be open to others, and to be inviting, it should be our focus in 2025 to reach out to our neighbors and to invite them to join us in some way. Worship with us, dine with us, ride with us, serve with us; come and see what 'new thing' God is doing, and let us continue to spread the Word here in Bluffton. 


